This year marks the 50th anniversary of Mental Health Week, running from October 7-14, which promotes positive mental health in the community and breaks down the stigmas of the past. It will include more than <u>45 events and activities across the State</u>. A series of events will run in metropolitan Perth alongside a regional events program.

WAAMH CEO Rod Astbury said he was heartened to see such strong interest in running community events, including many from community groups in regional WA, made possible through the generous support of Lotterywest.

"This year, we are really putting the spotlight on improving the mental health of all people across our vast state, especially regional areas," Mr Astbury said.

"WA has a need perhaps more than any other state to breach the enormous physical distances that separate us, so that the Mental Health Week message reaches everyone. This starts with the Opening Ceremony to be held in Kalgoorlie on October 7, followed by all the great events being held in the week following by community groups in towns such as Broome, Narrogin, Albany and Port Hedland," said Mr Astbury.

"Many of these regional events are an opportunity to start a conversation about mental health in the community and for people to learn about and connect with local mental health service providers if they have concerns about their own wellbeing or that of someone they know," he said.
