Your voice as a consumer, carer or family member is crucial in ensuring the future mental health system in our state is high-quality, person-centred and works well for future generations.

WA's peak bodies representing mental health and consumers invite you to participate in a community conversation about the future of the mental health system.

These events will help you understand the WA Government's 'Sustainable Health Review', why it is so important and how you can influence it. We will then conduct a workshop with smaller groups to ensure everyone can contribute. There are two dates to choose from and an expenses contribution of \$15 will be available at the event for people attending in an unpaid capacity.

WHY IS MY VOICE SO IMPORTANT?

The WA Government recently released the *'Interim Report of the Sustainable Health Review'*, with recommendations for changes to mental health services (and the wider health landscape). The review is aimed at prioritising patient-centred, high quality and financially sustainable healthcare in WA and the final report is due in November, so now is an important time to let the review know if they are on the right track. The **Report Summary** provides a handy overview of these.
